



#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

March was Women's History Month. Look back and think about one thing you may have done during the month to observe or advocate for women's issues.

**April, too, has a very important date** for us to observe. Equal Pay Day falls on April 12 this year. The date changes from year to year. It also changes from country to country. This year April 12, 2017 is the day that marks when American women's pay for the year, starting in January of 2016, catches up with the amount that men earned, ending in December of 2016.

This pay gap has many repercussions that go beyond just fairness or equality. The lower wages make it much more difficult for women to pay back student loans. This diminishes the reward that is promised for working hard to achieve a higher level education. Women have a much harder time achieving a comfortable lifestyle. Women have a harder time paying for health insurance and enjoying a healthy life. Women have a much harder time dealing with transportation to work and finding, and paying for, child care. The pay gap means that many more women than men live in poverty.

These are all issues that AAUW advocates for. Women's rights are human rights, and it starts with equal pay. We can be proud of our state for passing the California Equal Pay Act, but we need to be vigilant in our support of AAUW's daily fight for equal pay across the nation. Go to the AAUW.org website and see what you can do to help. Let's see if we can get Equal Pay Day to come earlier next year!

I want to thank our nominating committee for giving their time and energy this year. Thank you to Clydene Leslie, Pam Bone, and Shirley Chang. Please consider taking on a position with CHAR AAUW next year. Our branch would benefit, you would benefit, and AAUW would benefit!

Public Policy Equal Pay Day is the symbolic day dedicated to raising awareness of the gender pay gap. It was last celebrated on April 12, 2016; since this date symbolizes how far into the year women must work to earn what men earned in the previous year, the exact day differs both by year and by country.



**The Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act,** signed on January 29, 2009, is the very first piece of legislation that President Obama signed into law. The law, named after a woman who discovered her employer was paying less than men doing the same job, makes it easier for women to effectively challenge unequal pay. The law amended the Civil Rights Act of 1964 so that unfair pay complaints can be filed within 180 days of a discriminatory paycheck -- and that 180 days resets after each paycheck.

The 45th annual Home Tour sponsored by AAUW Amador Branch will take place in the historic Gold Rush town of Sutter Creek. The Tour, "Strolling Sutter Creek," will be held on Saturday, April 22, 2017 from 11 AM to 4 PM and will feature five fantastic historic homes that have been remodeled and restored to incorporate respect for the past with the need for updated comfort and style. In addition, docents will guide ticket holders though five living history sites including: the Sutter Creek Fire Museum; the Catholic Cemetery with headstones from the 1850s; and a General Store Museum preserved from the turn of the century. Also, the first two living history projects undertaken by the Sutter Creek Community Benefit Foundation (SCCBF) will be available for touring: Miners' Bend Park; and the Sutter Creek Grammar School. Tea and homemade cookies will be served in the social hall of the historic Methodist Church while live music plays and the 2017 Opportunity Quilt is proudly displayed until raffled off at 3:30 PM.
