Bylaws Changes

The following proposed bylaws amendments were passed unanimously at the 8/21/15 board meeting. They will be voted on by membership at the General Meeting on March 12, 2016.

underlined italics mean deletion ARTICLE IV.MEMBERSHIP AND DUES () means new language

Section 5. Dues

- a. Amount
- 1. Changes in branch dues shall be determined at the annual meeting by two-thirds vote of those present and voting, provided notice has been given to the members $\underline{30}$ (15) days prior to the meeting.

Rationale: The number of days notice for election of officers and amending bylaws is 15. The notice timing should be the same...whatever allows the board to conduct business in a reasonable time frame and is fair for members to ask questions.

ARTICLE VI.OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers

- a. The elected officers for the branch shall be a president, vice presidents for program, membership (and) AAUW Funds, secretary and treasurer.
- b. The appointed officers shall be <u>auditor</u>, bylaws, (C/U Partnership), local scholar-ship, <u>parliamentarian</u>, <u>public information</u>, public policy, Tech-Trek and international-VGIF. **Rationale**: auditor is not necessarily a member of CHAR; parliamentarian and public information will be moved to Administration.
- e. All vacancies in office shall be filled for the unexpired term by the board of directors with the exception of president or co-presidents. The vice-presidents in the order listed shall fill a vacancy in the office of president *or co-presidents*.

Rationale: The way it is written implies that losing one of the co-presidents precipitates a VP stepping in. Section 1-f already explains that any officer position, including president, may be filled by a co-officer, so there's no need to mention the co-president possibility in 1 -e.

FYI: 1-f. Each office may be filled by an officer or co-officers.

Section 2. Duties

d. The treasurer shall be responsible for collecting, distributing and accounting for the funds of the branch (by the specified deadline). Omit the following; place in policies and procedures. The treasurer shall collect dues and properly remit them to AAUW National and State by the specified deadline. The treasurer shall send money for AAUW Funds by the specified deadline. Separate ledgers (accounts) shall be kept for each fund.

Rationale: This makes it more general, in keeping with the duties listed for the other officers. The details of types of funds, accounts etc. belong in the branch policies and procedures, not the bylaws.

ARTICLE VII. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Composition. The board of directors shall include the elected officers and the following appointed officers: <u>auditor</u>, C/U Partnership, <u>parliamentarian</u>, bylaws, public policy, <u>public information</u>, Tech Trek and international VGIF.

Public Policy: **Over the holidays** I had the opportunity to visit with a new friend in North Canton, Ohio, who had done considerable research on Human Trafficking last year. Unlike much of the Sacramento research that has taken place the last few years, this focused on Asia. Similar attempts to rescue victims had taken place. They subsequently were placed in a safe home setting in the United States for rehabilitation. They were taught skills

home setting in the United States for rehabilitation. They were taught skills such as making jewelry for sale. The jewelry was then sold to receptive markets. From what I understood, the girls were then returned to Asia and released.

We Can Do It!

Since attending CHAR's Panel on Human Trafficking I have begun to wonder. What have you become aware of lately? I would like to hear from you. I have been encouraged in learning about many other AAUW branches sponsoring programs on Human Trafficking.

Several organizations in our area are actively involved in helping victims. If you are interested in volunteering, WEAVE, My Sister's House, Breaking Free, Courage Worldwide would welcome your interest. Breaking Free has programs they take into the schools that help students learn how not to be vulnerable to attractive young predators.


