



DAYS FOR GIRLS

AAUW CHAR and AAUW @ ARC students led by Mary Quynh joined me and my Rocklin team in preparing over 10,000 masks that were delivered to medical staff and frontline volunteers at food banks, hospice, domestic abuse victims, Shriner's Hospital, Mercy San Juan, and Volunteer Organization for Active Disasters.

The Days for Girls Hygiene kits we were making for the United Nations Refugee Camp in Rwanda were put on hold because COVID-19 has challenged, not only taking kits to Rwanda, but the entire process of distributing them around the world. All the elements to complete the 500 DFG Kits were stored.

Then I received a call from San Francisco. The United Farm Workers in Salinas had an immediate need for DFG Kits and the only kits readily available were the CHAR kits. We asked Cathy Foxhaven and Dianne Owens for the OK and they were very excited. It was decided that this was an excellent project

We sent enough for 500 kits. We kept 100 to see if we could find refugees along the Mexican Border needing the kits. We learned that the people at the border are being cared for. There were also inquir-

ies from the Hopi and Navajo Indians reservations. Not many girls are attending school right now so the kits are not used to allow girls to attend school, but they are used in helping women and girls exist.

One day we will go to Rwanda and we will need to replace the 500 kits we gave away. But right now those kits are helping people in the USA, and we have leads for others who might need them closer to home. Some of our teams are still working on the kits while sheltering in place. 
Tech Trek Winners 2020
