Lee Battershell hostessed a Zoom meeting with students and AAUW chapter representatives from ARC, CSUS, UC Davis and Sierra on May 3rd. Students are taking classes online. Some of the students are keeping in touch with each other. We discussed what we can do to reach out to students to encourage them to join AAUW student clubs. "Work Smart/ Start Smart" was talked about as a good program to offer to the campuses. We will have another Zoom meeting in September. Some of the ARC students are helping Days for Girls sewing masks. As with everyone, we are unsure when campuses will open for students and staff to return.

National Foundation Names Honored

Each year outstanding AAUW members who make significant contributions to the mission of AAUW are recognized in the Names Honored book published annually by the National Foundation and honored at a Branch General meeting. This year we are especially fortunate because four CHAR members will receive recognition at the National level for their contributions. AAUW California President Dianne Owens will present these awards June 13 at our Zoom general meeting.

Our honorees are: Shirley and Vern Chang

Shirley has been a member of CHAR for over 40 years, served in many offices including president, has held CHAR together in both the lean years and the years of plenty. Under Shirley's guidance as



AAUW-Funds Chair in 2019 our contributions grew 150 percent over the prior year. The incentives she put in place show that AAUW-Funds will grow even more in calendar year 2020. Vern joined this past year as fundraising chair. Under his tutelage we found we need to do much to get our branch in shape so we will be more desirable to outside donors. For example, Vern is heading a study working with American River College to either prove or disprove that the Local scholarships we award to head of household parents allow those parents to break the welfare cycle. Their income is higher and their children are more in-

clined to finish high school and earn higher level degrees.

Karen Wilkes

Karen is head of CHAR Days for Girls. She led CHAR in making hygiene kits for girls and women all over the world so young girls can attend school and women can work during their menses. Many girls stayed at home during menses falling behind the boys in their studies and eventually dropping out of school. Women who use the hygiene



kit don't have to miss work so their life and the local economy is better because of new found women power. Karen is working with the United Nations to supply the kits to refugee camps in Rwanda and Uganda also teaching refugees how to make the kits themselves. During COVID-19 Karen turned her team's sewing power from making hygiene kits to making masks. As of May 1 she has supplied over 8,627 kits to places like nursing homes, Kaiser Hospital, WEAVE, My Sister's House, and more. Karen received the George Washington Honor Medal presented by the Freedoms Foundation, a national, non-profit, non-partisan, non-sectarian educational organization. Since 1949, Freedoms Foundation bestowed the Honor Medal on 57,000 people they believe are exemplars of responsible citizenship.

Erin Saberi



Erin is head of CHAR Sacramento for Women and Girls. The County of Sacramento awarded Erin and her CHAR Sacramento for Women and Girls \$10,000 to do a Blue Ribbon Study showing why Sacramento County needs a Commission for Women and Girls. For more than 18 months Erin and her group went into each of the five districts in Sacramento County asking women and girls "How are you?" She built a consortium of over 80 women's organizations and testified before the Sacramento County board explaining that such a Commission, sanctioned and recognized by the United Nations Commission on the status of women, is needed for a two-fold purpose, to identify those laws and policies that have intended or unintended adverse impact on

women and girls, and to place an umbrella over the many organizations that exist to help women and girls so there is better coordination and better effectiveness and adding more where needed.

Keeping Connected as we Shelter in Place

As social distancing continues and probably will for the foreseeable future, here are a few ideas from California branches on how they are keeping things going as we shelter in place:

- Hold your meetings online using some form of online conferencing like Zoom or Google Hangouts.
- Set up a member-helping-member network to touch base and to identify your at-risk folks who might need grocery or prescription pick-up. Dust off the old-fashioned phone tree. Ask your board members to each call a list of names just to say "Hello!"
- Interest Groups:
 - Book groups: members read the assigned book and then discuss online in a virtual meeting.
 - o Drama or play reading groups: find a YouTube video of a production of the play and send the link to your members to view. Then discuss in a virtual meeting.
 - o Hiking groups: challenge members to get out anyway. Set up a shared spreadsheet on Google Sheets for everyone to record their miles and trails to hit a goal. Hikers can also share videos/photos of their solo hikes. A fun idea is to have an identification contest for the wildflowers seen along the trails.
 - o Craft groups: host a virtual Show and Tell.
 - Lunch and dinner groups: gather virtually to share a meal. Show off your sand-wiches, but don't talk with your mouth full. We can see you.
 - Public Policy groups have PLENTY of time now to write letters to legislators. Encourage them with ideas and templates. How about a GOTV postcard challenge?
 - Garden Group members can post video tours of their blooming gardens. Maybe a name-that- plant contest?
- Stay on top of the AAUW mission: ask members to recommend related TED talks for all to view, then discuss in an online meeting.
- Lighten things up: host a virtual meeting for members to share a joke or a funny story.
- Get busy on your branch's Facebook page: consider setting up a separate private "social group" page just for keeping in touch.
- Send your members an AAUW-related scavenger hunt, crossword puzzle or BINGO game (easy to create with free online tools). Did someone say "contest?"


